



## ALL GALS GOLF CLUB POINT SYSTEM

This is our club point system. Points are earned at each of our Tournaments. You must have an Index and be in a flight to receive NET SCORE POINTS. Any member shooting a NET score of 91 or higher receives five (5) points, or if you do not have an Index, you will receive five (5) participation points (once you receive an index than you will be eligible to receive the point system. If you start at round and cannot complete for any reason you will receive five (5) points (due to weather, illness, etc).

Those Members who have an Index are eligible for prizes at the Year-End Tournament & Awards banquet. (You must be present to win - extreme exceptions are taken into consideration).

**You must post at least five (5) A.G.G.C. tournaments and three (3) outside scores during our season.** This is required in order to qualify for the top prize places. Our time frame will be from January 1 until the Monday after our last scheduled Tournament in order to qualify at our End of Year prize awards. If you post 5 or more Outside Rounds you will receive an additional 5 Bonus Points. However, the cut-off date for the **5 Bonus Points** for **outside rounds** is September 30<sup>th</sup>. (*See All Gals By-Laws Rule 8, 9 & 10*).

**PLEASE NOTE:** You must Post every time you complete an 18-hole round or combine the scores of two consecutive rated nine-hole rounds, played under the principles of the Rules of Golf. (No NET points are awarded for your outside rounds, but will count as an outside round).

Posting consecutive nine-hole scores is defined as two **rated** nine-hole rounds played without an intervening 18-hole round. Consecutive nine-hole scores include playing nine-holes on a golf course on the same or different days, playing the same nine-holes twice, and playing nine-hole rounds on two different golf courses.
